

Music Intervals

*In the music world, an interval is the distance between two notes

C-Major Scale...

Diagram illustrating the C-Major Scale with intervals between notes:

- Do (C) to Re (D): (Whole Step) M2
- Re (D) to Mi (E): M2
- Mi (E) to Fa (F): (a 1/2 Step) m2
- Fa (F) to So (G): M2
- So (G) to La (A): M2
- La (A) to Ti (B): M2
- Ti (B) to Do (C): m2

Perfect Unison (P1)
(Same pitch)
- Minor 2nd (m2)**
(1 1/2 Steps)
"Joy To The World"
- Major 2nd (M2)**
(2 1/2 Steps)
"Silent Night"
- 5**
Minor 3rd (m3)
(3 1/2 Steps)
"Jesus Loves Me"
- Major 3rd (M3)**
(4 1/2 Steps)
"Holy, Holy, Holy"
- Perfect 4th (P4)**
(5 1/2 Steps)
"Here Comes The Bride"
- 8**
Augmented 4th / Diminished 5th
(6 1/2 Steps)
"Maria"
- Perfect 5th (P5)**
(7 1/2 Steps)
"Twinkle, Twinkle Little Star"
- 10**
Minor 6th (m6) / Augmented 5th
(8 1/2 Steps)
"Love Story" (where do I begin?..)
- Major 6th (M6)**
(9 1/2 Steps)
"My Bonnie Lies Over The Ocean"
- 12**
Minor 7th (m7)
(10 1/2 Steps)
"Somewhere" (there's a place for us...)
- Major 7th (M7)**
(11 1/2 Steps)
Find octave, then come down 1/2 step
- Perfect Octave (P8)**
(12 1/2 Steps)
